<p><b>The “vivre ensemble” among youth Anglophones and Francophones in Quebec</b></p>	<p>Young English-speaking Quebecers, most of whom are bilingual, wish to fully integrate and participate in a province that is primarily French-speaking. However, recent studies have shown that while these young people do not consider themselves a minority (their language remains a source of significant power in the world), they do not feel fully integrated in Quebec society. Testimonials from Senate reports (2011) and the Palmer Study (2015) prepared for PCH agree that cooperation between the French-speaking majority and the English-speaking minority is key to maintaining the vitality of English-speaking communities in Quebec. Further, interactions between language groups transform the idea of contact into a real, interpersonal experience that breaks down bias and creates networks that foster socio-economic integration.</p> <p>Recent research with young Francophones highlights a paradigm shift in how English is perceived: several view proficiency in English as a “sought-after and essential skill in the workplace and in the context of globalization”. This pro-English bias does not appear to have much effect on young people’s concerns about the future of French: only 13% consider the future of French to be secure, while 87% feel that it is uncertain, and even threatened.
